Compare quotes, financing terms, and what's included across surgeons — so the lowest advertised price doesn't fool you.



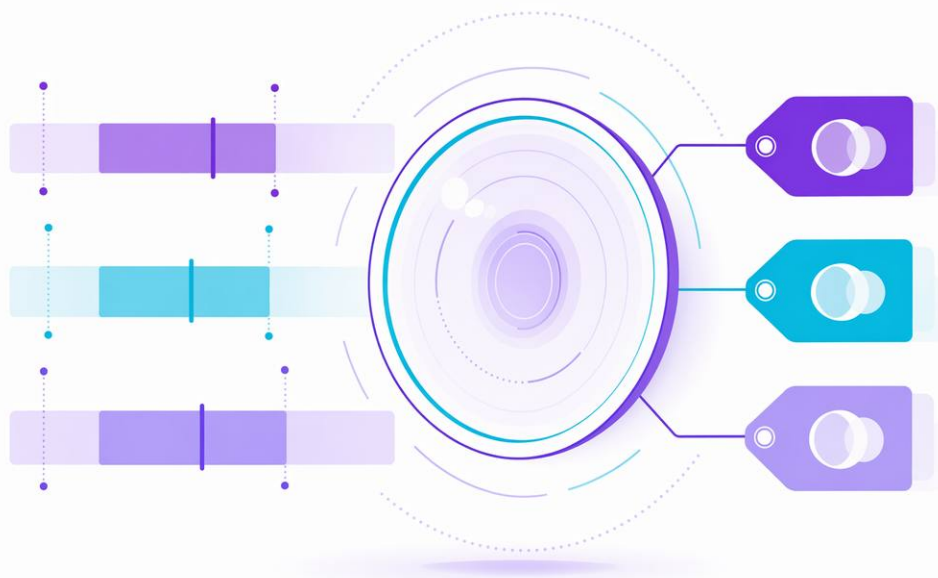
Understand your vision-correction options with clear eyes — then get matched, free, with licensed eye surgeons near you for a consultation. You compare and choose who you trust. Nothing here is medical advice.

Why the advertised price is rarely the real price

A low headline number per eye often leaves out the technology, follow-ups, or an enhancement. Surgery is also rarely covered by insurance. Compare the all-in price, not the ad. These figures are estimates, not quotes.

Line up each quote side by side

- Price per eye (and for both eyes)
- Which laser/technology is included
- Follow-up visits — included or extra?
- Enhancement policy — free, discounted, or full price, and for how long?
- What happens if you're not a candidate after the exam



Questions that reveal the real cost

- 1 Is this your all-in price, or a starting price?
- 2 What is NOT included in this number?
- 3 What are the real financing terms — interest, length, total paid?
- 4 Can I use FSA/HSA funds? (General info — confirm with your plan.)
- 5 Is there any 'today only' discount? (A reason to slow down.)

Score each surgeon

For each consultation, mark whether every line above is included, excluded, or unclear. The most complete, honest answer — not the lowest number — is usually the better value. And it is always OK to wait.
